

Troop 19 Summer Camp

Camp Bell – July 14 - 20

This summer, our scouts may:

- 1) Camp with Troop 19 at Camp Bell for session 4, the week July 14-20.
- 2) Camp with scouts from other troops as a provisional troop at Hidden Valley or another scout camp.
- 3) If over 14, work as a Counselor-in-Training for two weeks at Camp Bell and Hidden Valley or at Camp Carpenter.
- 4) Mow Mr. Anthony's lawn (*a popular choice, recommend early signup, sorry does not count as a service project*)
- 5) All of the above

But no matter which camp a scout is considering, if their annual health and medical record is set to expire before camp, **schedule a medical exam with their doctor now!** A current, doctor signed, BSA annual health and medical record with a copy of insurance card attached is required to attend summer camps. We require two copies of the medical form and insurance cards. The medical form can be found on the troop website <http://troop19.org/>

Troops attending Camp Bell work on strengthening their patrol structure through patrol cooking and day-long patrol activities at a program area. Advancement opportunities for first year scouts and returning scouts are readily available.

Patrols may work with Camp Staff to customize their own program – night hikes, rope projects, conservation projects, swim lessons, etc. Scouts 14 and over may attend the Valley Voyageurs (5 day 4 night backpack, kayak, climbing) and rejoin their troop for the remainder of the week. Camp Bell has no provisional camp program; scouts must attend with a troop.

Medical Record

Having the proper medical records at camp is a tedious process yet vital to ensure the safety of our scouts. Please review the following information carefully and plan to have the paperwork completed and submitted to Troop 19 by May 14th.

CHECKLIST FOR REVIEWING MEDICAL PAPERWORK

- ✓ Is there a parent signature with date on the form (this grants participation and permission to treat)? Is the date clearly identifiable?
- ✓ Is there a Doctor's signature with date on the form (dated within the past 12 months of your stay)? Is it valid throughout your stay at camp?
- ✓ If the Doctor used an electronic signature, did someone from his/her office manually sign to verify it?
- ✓ If there have been any changes since the form was completed, have they been properly recorded?
- ✓ Does the form indicate: Troop 19 - Daniel Webster Council, July 14-20, 2019?
- ✓ Is the form written in ink and completely legible (especially after being copied)?
- ✓ Does the form list all allergies (especially dietary allergies)? Are all answered?
- ✓ If the participant has food allergies, please contact the Food Service or Camp Director after June 10th.
- ✓ Are two copies of the medical form submitted?
- ✓ Are two copies of your insurance card submitted?
- ✓ If required, have you included the inhaler and epi-pen forms?

- ✓ Is there a date for the most recent Tetanus shot? Must be within ten years. No need to attach any immunization forms.
- ✓ Are you certain that the medication that is listed on the med form will be brought to camp? If there are any changes after the med form is submitted (either med is added or deleted), a note from the doctor should be given to us upon checking into camp.
- ✓ Have you submitted all forms to Troop 19 by **Tuesday, May 14th**?

Supplemental Information Regarding Health and Medical Forms

- Every Scout and every Adult must submit a completed and current [BSA Annual Health and Medical Form](#) in order to attend camp. All adults must also be current in Youth Protection Training.
- Parts A, B & C of the form must be complete.
- A doctor's signature (accompanied by a date which is within 12 months) must be present. The doctor's signature affirms a physical examination has taken place within the past twelve months and all information contained upon the form is both valid and up to date.
- The BSA Annual Health and Medical Record is the only permitted form to be used for Boy Scout resident summer camp.
- Please work with your doctor to include all information within the BSA form and avoid using attachments.
- Note: Medical forms will not be returned to you at the end of your stay per NH law.
- Convenient MD is readily available to get a \$20 physical (they do not submit to insurance so you can still go to regular PCP for annual physical) <https://convenientmd.com/patient-services/sports-school-camp-physicals/>
- Only legal medications are allowed. Legal medications are medications in their original containers with a doctor name, patient name, administration instructions, dosage and date on the pharmacy label (or accompanied by a doctor's note with this information on his/her stationery). Only send the number of pills needed. There should be specific times listed for dispensation of each medication, as well (i.e.: please define 'twice daily' etc.).

*****THERE IS A SPECIFIC FORM WHICH NEEDS TO ACCOMPANY THE MEDICATION LISTING MEDICATION NAME, DOSAGE, FREQUENCY***WILL BE EMAILED OUT WITH CAMP INFORMATION

- If any changes occur to the information provided on the pharmacy-labeled container (or doctor's note), another updated doctor's note must be included which describes and approves such. Only medications described and included on the medical form will be allowed.
- Parental 'permissions' do not replace, supplant or alter doctor's written orders on medical forms. A note from the doctor must clarify or clearly indicate when medications are only taken on an 'as needed' basis (i.e.: the nurse, parent or Reservation staff may never change the orders issued from a doctor on a medical form). New medications prescribed after the medical form was completed must be accompanied by a current doctor's note indicating the information above, etc. **A new medical form listing all medicine dosages and frequencies will need to be completed.**
- The camp provides basic over-the-counter medications. You will need to check the box on the medical form stating your child can have over the counter medications from camp (Tylenol, Benadryl, Ibuprofen etc. You will need to list those that they cannot have.
- Special over-the-counter medications (i.e.: specific brands) will be permitted only with a note from the doctor authorizing such. All medications will be self-administered in the presence of medical personnel. Unit Leaders will accompany Scouts/Venturers at the times of medication distribution for ID purposes.
- **INSURANCE:** The Daniel Webster Council insures each of its registered Scouts and Leaders for accidents, sickness or injury that may occur during their stay at camp. This insurance coverage is secondary coverage only, meaning it will only cover those expenses that are not recoverable under any other policy.
- **EPI-PEN & INHALER PERMISSION FORM:** The State of New Hampshire requires resident camp participants under the age of eighteen who carry epi-pens and/or inhalers to submit a permission form. Your Doctor will need to sign this form.
